Treasurer's Report: CHCA has a balance of \$7,633.41 in its accounts.

Student Ambassadors' Update on Harborfields Central School District (HCSD): Joshua Krief provided an update of Harborfields School events:

- Homecoming events
- Harborfields sports
- Inductions into National Honor Society and NYSSMA (New York School of Music Association)
- Hispanic Heritage Month
- Collaboration between school board members, administrators, and students. Welcome to Dr. Philip Farrelly, new principal at Harborfields High School.

Vote on CHCA Slate of Officers for 2025: Anne W. announced that the CHCA membership will be voting on the slate of CHCA officers for the year 2025 in the November General Membership meeting.

The membership was encouraged to become Board members.

Overview by Bob Lopez: B. Lopez provided an overview of each of the guest speakers' curriculum vitae.

October Speakers:

Dr. Anastasios Manaris, electro-cardiologist, Mount Sinai Hospital (Heart Health): Dr. Manaris provided a detailed overview regarding cardiovascular disease, its diagnosis and treatment.

- Calcium screening is a great test to evaluate heart condition; stress test; nuclear imaging; PET scans; cardiac scans. Chemical stress test vs. regular stress test. Regular stress (Bruce Protocol) is given to people who can exercise and who appear to be low risk.
- Chemical test (injection of radioisotope) is administered along with exercise. The Lexi Scan simulates exercise.
- Explanation of cardiac-rehab; Holter monitor (seven year battery life).
- Dr. Manaris was accompanied by a staff member. He also provided a model of heart and models of pacemakers.
- Dr. Manaris provided information regarding the diagnosis of Afib.

Dr. Errol Toulon, Sheriff for Suffolk County Sheriff's Department (Presentation of the Suffolk County Sheriff's Department): Dr. Toulon shared his family history, education, and details of the different law enforcement positions he's held.

• Dr. Toulon provided a very thorough description regarding the rehabilitation of people who have been incarcerated and those who have been victims of human trafficking.

- The Suffolk County Sheriff's department created the first human trafficking program to help those who have been victimized.
- The Suffolk County Sheriff's Department created the Start Resource Center to support people who have been incarcerated. 85% of those people will return to our communities. People released from jail are dropped off at a safe location.
- People newly mainstreamed to the community can reach out to the Resource Centers to find work.
- Resource Centers receive food and clothing for those in need through business donations connected to respective neighborhoods.
- A Gun Control Program exists. Social Services help families to break generational crime.
- The Start Resource Program has 10-15% recidivism, much lower than most other parts of New York State.

Invitation to the Vanderbilt Mansion: There will be a possible invitation for the CHCA Membership to visit the Vanderbilt Museum on the evening of December 4th, 2024.

• If extended, the invitation will be opened to the first 50 CHCA members who sign up for the event.

News on Heron Park/CHCA Fundraiser: CHCA members were encouraged to "Buy a Brick".
